"least evangelized spot on earth"



Christianity is declining in Europe to the extent that it has been described as the "least evangelized spot on earth" Less than four percent of the total population in Europe is evangelical and in most European countries Ireland included the percentage falls to less than one percent.

What do I mean by Evangelical?

The word "evangelical" is floated around in churches, the media and particularly in this year's election but many have no idea what an evangelical is. Many Christians themselves still have a hard time agreeing on what exactly defines an evangelical. Ellison Research

asked the average adult American what they believe is an "evangelical Christian." Thirty-six percent of them said they had no idea. Six percent of Americans said evangelicals are defined according to their political worldview. These people said evangelicals are conservative, ultra-conservative or radical right, anti-homosexual, Republican, highly involved in politics, etc. So here is my definition of an evangelical. It is a three-fold definition: "An Evangelical believes: (1) the Bible is authoritative in faith and practice; (2) in a conversion to believe in and follow Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord through rebirth by the Holy Spirit); (3) in sharing this message of faith with others through evangelism and social witness." In a nut shell what I mean by an Evangelical is someone who makes the Gospel of Jesus Christ central to his or her speaking, thinking, and living.

Your kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

I have been thinking about what Jesus said in Matthew 6:10 and how we should pray. Another word for God's "kingdom" is God's "Rule" so lately I have been praying that Jesus would come and rule in my life and in the lives of those I come in contact with, and those I am praying for. So when you pray for us here in Ireland you could be saying to the Lord; "Your will be done in Ireland as it is in heaven."
